From Your Pastor

Recently, I read that the Merriam-Webster dictionary people declared the Word of the Year for 2023 is *authentic*—"the term for something we're thinking about, writing about, aspiring to, and judging more than ever."

Authentic has been a high-volume lookup most years, but the word saw a substantial increase in 2023, driven by stories and conversations about artificial intelligence (AI), celebrity culture, identity, and social media.

Authentic has a number of meanings including "not false or imitation," a synonym of real and actual; and also "true to one's own personality, spirit, or character." Although clearly a desirable quality, authentic is hard to define and subject to debate—two reasons why it sends many people to the dictionary.

Authentic is often connected to identity, whether national or personal: words frequently modified by authentic include cuisine and dish, but also self and voice. Celebrities like singers Lainey Wilson, Sam Smith, and especially Taylor Swift all made headlines in 2023 with statements about seeking their "authentic voice" and "authentic self." Headlines like "Three Ways To Tap Into Taylor Swift's Authenticity And Build An Eras-Like Workplace" associate the quality of authentic with pop-culture superpower.

And with the rise of artificial intelligence—and its impact on deepfake videos, actors' contracts, academic honesty, and a vast number of other topics—the line between "real" and "fake" has become increasingly blurred. And if any of our older members are still reading by now, I invite you to remember the stars of years past singing on The Ed Sullivan Show—well, it looked like they were singing. Sometimes the mouth stopped before the words stopped—showing they were lip-syncing and not "really" singing. The performance was an act; it was not authentic! Well, that still goes on today.

Of the definitions and applications of *authentic* that I see, the one that very much troubles me is the definition "true to one's own personality, spirit, or

character." That may be good and may be not good. If it is a desire to be true to one's personality, spirit, or character as a reborn child of God through faith in Jesus and by the working of the Holy Spirit, being authentic is highly desirable. But if it is a desire to be true to one's sinful personality, spirit, or character, well, that is a desire to be put away, or as God's Word tells us, "put to death what belongs to your worldly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desire, and greed, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming" (Colossians 3:5-6). In the following verses the Holy Spirit goes on to teach us what is authentic about being a child of God: "But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its Creator" (vv. 7-10).

To be authentic is to be seeking God's grace and His guidance through His Word to more and more live as He created us to live—as He has now recreated us to live—by faith in the Son of God who loves us and lives in us (Gal. 2:20).

The Son of God has lived the authentic existence for you and for me. He humbled Himself to be born for us to be our Savior. Jesus once said, "I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will but the will of Him who sent Me" (John 6:38). The will of the Father took Him all the way to the cross to pay for all our sins of rebellion against our Creator. Risen from death He lives as the authentic, real, and unfailing love of the Father for us. True to His character, He will never forsake the soul that seeks Him: "The Lord is good to those who wait for Him, to the soul that seeks Him" (Lam. 3:25). Trust His Word and promises. "The Word of the Lord endures forever" (1 Peter 1:25), and that is real for you, dear child of God!




Why Do We Need a Pregnancy Resource Center?

Sioux City and Storm Lake on Sunday morning. The GSH is a short service of that week's Bible readings, a hymn, a sermon message, a creed, Lord's Prayer and blessing. It is perfect for shut-ins and those home sick, who don't have access to their home church's service and for anyone else. Most important, the GSH is available to those who don't know Jesus at all or have fallen away from him.

The Good Shepherd Hour's was originally started in connection with the chaplaincy in Sioux City, but the chaplaincy has ended. Its current speaker is Pastor Trevor Freudenburg of the LCMS. Main Street Living is a televised worship service produced in conjunction with Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod churches and pastors. Local LCMS pastors attend recording days

about every two months to record a liturgy and sermon. These services are then edited to include regional choirs and aired on location television stations. Six unique regional services are produced and aired each week.

- * The mission of Main Street Living is to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ using television and other media.
- * Main Street is NOT intended to be a replacement for inperson worship, but is here to provide liturgical services to those who are unable to attend a local service.
- * The main source of support comes from viewers and their families in the form of mail-in donations, online donations and memorials which are tax-deductible.
- * MSL is a designated 501(c)(3) corporation in the state of South Dakota. It is governed by a board of directors and facilitated by an Executive Director. Additionally, each market has its own leadership and production teams who recruit, schedule and record pastors and choirs—as well as process local donations.
- * Choirs are comprised of members from surrounding LCMS congregations. Choir recording sessions meet at area churches and record around a dozen hymns to be edited into future services.
- * The program is broadcast each Sunday at 10 am on KCAU-Sioux City or at 10:30 am on WOWT-Omaha.
- * MSL can be viewed anytime at MainStreetLiving.com or their Facebook page.



It was the first time I heard this, so I tuned into the station and started listening. I was hearing God's Word in a way I had never heard it before. I was very surprised when I heard the message at the end. The word of God that was being transmitted that night was about Jesus Christ's salvation, healing, and eternal life after death by believing in Him. Hearing this raised a big question in me because I had never thought about life after death before.

The next week I waited for the same time and heard the word of God. I wanted to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, but I didn't know what to do. There was no one near me who could tell me or explain the word I heard. At the end of the program, when the phone numbers were given, I quickly wrote them down and the next day I called the person who picked up the phone. He helped me to pray a prayer of repentance to believe the Lord immediately on the phone.

He also advised me to go to the nearest church and talk to them, which I did right away. I now worship regularly at this church and attend confirmation classes. I now have joy and a different peace in my heart.

My family protested against my decision because my previous faith was Islam, but I was happy to find the path of truth. Thank you Lord, because of this African radio program, I know salvation is only through Jesus Christ."

Prayer and praise report on Kathy's health:


