### From Your Pastor

A few years ago I added a strip of flowers to the area I garden on the south side of our church building. I am most certainly inclined to plant something I can eat, but I have learned the value of flowers in and near a garden. Flowers attact various insects which aid in pollination. Flowers also have value in the area of companion planting (you can ask me if you are interested). Somehow and sometime an iris rhizome (more commonly called a bulb) found its way to the garden from the bed beside the parsonage garage. I almost tossed it into my compost pile, but then decided to plant it at the end of the flower strip.

Year after year it took up space, but never bloomed. More than once I thought of pulling it up and tossing it, but did not. I guess my thinking was in line with Jesus' parable in Luke 13:6-9, "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?' And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'" Well, I never gave the iris any special care, but it remained, "this year also."

Then this year, as you can see in the picture, it sent up nine stalks of multiple blooms! Amazing! In this iris I keep finding applications to God's working in us, His faithfulness to us, and how He produces good in our lives as we trust His promises.

First of all, I am very thankful that the Lord is patient with me, because my fruitfulness for Him many times has failed. God's mercy and His steadfast love is shown in that "He does not treat us as our sins deserve, or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His love for those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:10-12).

Second, I am thankful for His promises to bless our efforts of faith, even though the evidence may not be immediately seen. One of those promises is recorded in 1 Corinthians 15:58, "Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the



Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

We may not see any growth or benefit in our own weekly attendance in worship and the discipline of daily Bible reading, our prayer life, and our bringing our children to Sunday School and reading God's Word and praying with them, and yet, God promises that His Word will not return to Him empty, but that through His Word He will accomplish the purposes for which He sends it (Isaiah 55:11). That means He is slowly, gradually, strengthening and blessing our faith. He is maturing us and preparing us to bear fruit in us. This is the work of the Holy Spirit through the Word. He tells us "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Gal. 5:22-23).

Again, in the letter to the Galatians, St. Paul—who certainly did a lot of seed planting of God's Word without always witnessesing the havest—wrote words to admonish us and to encourage our faithful reception of God's gifts and living in God's ways: "Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up" (Gal. 6:8-9). Remain faithful and fruitful!





As the years progress her concerns are multiplied due to her mother's worsening health and her younger sister, Britta, wanting more details about her adoption and birth mother. Coupled with these problems is her disappointment when her long-time friend and confidant leaves the community to intern on his uncle's farm and her brother insists on moving their mother to his home in Missouri. As these events unfold. Susie faces the possibility of loss and wonders if longheld family secrets and missed opportunities will dim her hopes for her future.

### AFRICAN RADIO MINISTRIES—NEWS

### **Ethiopia Updates:**

In April, the ARM prison Ministry had 48 people declare their faith in Christ as Lord and Savior. Currently, 297 inmates are attending Confirmation Class and learning how to follow Jesus.

### **Radio Ministry Church Plant:**

A new church plant in Jinka, South Omo has 39 regular worshippers as a results of ARM programs. The congregation has doubled its size in just a few months. They struggle to find an adequate house of worship, especially when it rains. But they continue reaching beyond the mountains, sharing God's Word with neighboring villages.

#### Bible School student keeps church active:

Golenito is a thriving church that sits high atop a steep hill, seemingly in the middle of nowhere. But the 270 member congregation is strong and very active.

A severe drought has killed most of their crops and livestock. The winds blew their church down. But the committed believers gathered together what they could and rebuilt the church.

They are praising God for the Evangelist that is on scholarship through ARM. They know God is for them!

#### **Updates from Liberia—Foya District:**

The Kissi Radio program is blessing new church plants and strengthening existing ones.

District President, Rev. Ezekiel Saah and his pastors train evangelists to make the visitations when listeners call. As a result, four new preaching points have been established. Two churches, Worsongah and Kamboima, hold devotions each morning/evening, in addition to Sunday worship services. The other two locations, Paywahun and Kongbama, struggle with a heavy Islamic influence that is pulling new believers away. But a core group holds firm.

The ARM programs are also blessing the existing churches. In Foya, eleven people were baptized, seven confirmed and tithes have tripled!

#### ARM & HCO Merger:

Linda Kurtz, ARM Treasurer, has been overseeing the Liberian ARM work and the number of listener groups and churches is growing. She recently visited Ethiopia and has begun to supervise that work as well. Linda also manages Hope and Care Outreach in Liberia and regularly visits their clinic, schools, and orphanages as well as the ARM radio pastors. ARM and HCO are unofficially partners, but in May documents will be signed to formally merge the two organizations.


ARM will retain the name and donations will continue to support the radio and prison work. Linda's passion for sending the Gospel out via radio will be merged with HCO's mission to physically bless and improve the lives of listeners. The merger will allow John and Kathy to spend more time to establish the new radio program, and follow up, in Juba Arabic in South Sudan.
