From Your Pastor

"Don't forget to call!" "Let me know when you get there." "Don't forget about me!" We all have a desire to be remembered and this desire arises from a need to be loved, valued, and cared for. The fear of being forgotten is the fear of being left alone.

In such moments as a Christian you cry out to God and plead for His mercy to provide specific relief from your struggles. You await God's answer and expect His deliverance, His help, His relief . . . and sometimes, you don't see the remedy you seek! Maybe you have heard the words-maybe you have spoken them yourself-"God is not answering my prayers!"

Have you ever felt abandoned even by God? As Christians, we may feel uneasy about that question and say it would be wrong to feel that way! And yet, the very prayer book of the Bible, the book of Psalms, includes this prayer in which the feeling of being forgotten by God is guite explicit: "Will you forget me forever?" (Psalm 13:1). This is not an isolated plea! A number of similar examples are in the Bible: "Why have You forgotten me?" (Ps. 42:9); "Why do You hide Your face and forget our affliction?" (Psalm 44:24); "Why do You forget us forever?" (Lamentations 5:20).

Now, before we rush to other verses, let's acknowledge that sometimes we have felt abandoned and alone. There are times we feel as if God has forgotten us and that He is just not there for us.

Acknowledging the reality of this feeling is important. Talking to other Christians about feeling forgotten by God is not off limits or showing a lack of faith. Talking to God (as the Bible's authors give examples) and expressing this feeling to Him is not a lack of faith. In fact, it is an act of faith!

When you feel abandoned or forgotten, it's okay to tell God how you feel. The verses above teach us to do exactly that! But the act of praying to God is our acknowledgement that though we feel forgotten, we know that we are not forgotten. So we

go to God expressing how we feel, precisely because we know that He is listening!

We know we are not forgotten and that He is with us with compassion, mercy, kindness, and love-even in our times in which we feel alone and abandoned—because of Jesus, the One who enables us to find rest in God. Jesus, our Savior, invites all of us: "Come to Me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:28-29). It is Jesus who brings us into the presence of our Heavenly Father, and it is because of Him that we stand in His presence and even in the final judgment.

Jesus Himself taught us to pray, "Our Father who art in heaven." Martin Luther reminds us "With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father" (Small Catechism).


Because I see the love of God in the face of Jesus I pray to Him also for others who are afflicted, crushed, and feeling alone, and I trust He will not abandon us, even as He has promised: "I will never leave you, nor forsake you" (Heb. 13:5).

And for those times when it seems like He is not answering our prayers, we remember and we remind others that He answers our prayers in His way and in His time for our good. We cling to Him in faith, even when we do not see His work as we desire. He is faithful, and so we praise Him even in our darkness.

Psalm 13 begins with that desperate cry to God: "Will you forget me forever?" (Ps. 13:1), but it ends with words of praise: "But I have trusted in Your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in Your salvation. I will sing to the Lord, because He has dealt bountifully with me."

The Prayer Tree By Annie Jones

In the spring of 1942, the women of New Bethany, Tennessee, planted apple trees. In a field north of town, these women gathered around the trees on a given day each month to pray for "the boys" away at war. Long after the war, the tradition has endured.

Year after year, decade after decade, the women of the town had come each spring to plant new trees. The quiet grove of their creation stands as a testament to the faith, hope and strength of their mothers and grandmothers.

Each spring, for over 50 years, new prayer groups have formed with women participating for reasons including faith, community duty and social functions.

Time and pressure of the world in which we live have taken their toll on the custom of the prayer tree. Over the years the number of women volunteering to give one year to pray for the common good of their neighbors and one another has dwindled.

When the four people who showed up together, they argue, they cry, they laugh and they pray. What God does with and through them is nothing short of a miracle. For them and for all of New Bethany.

God who loves each of us beyond anything we could ever imagine. Read this book, be inspired and be thankful.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Riessen with 34 voting members present.

I. Opening Prayer

II. Reading/Approval of Minutes and Agenda Moved, seconded and approved to accept the reading of the January minutes and the April agenda.

III. Reports of Officers and Boards

A. Elders

Nothing to report.

B. Trustees (Loren Jepsen)

Caulking still needs to be done around the new windows at the parsonage.

Landscaping and soil sloping needs to be addressed as well. Both items will be taken care of when the weather stabilizes.

A kitchen sink is acting up as well as one of the furnaces. Verlin's Plumbing and Heating will be working on both issues.

There are two high school graduates this year: Kaitlyn Bruhn and Koen Miller. A small gathering for them will be held on May 7.

VBS will be held from July 9-13 in the evenings. Paint color was decided upon for the education unit upgrade.

We began 2023 with 608 baptized members on the books; and 501 communicant members on the books. We have received 7 by Holy Baptism (1 adult). We have added 6 communicant members by adult confirmation. We have had one death: Larry Clausen. We released one from our roll by personal request. As of today, April 16, 2023 we have 619 baptized members on and 505 communicant members on our roll.

As of yesterday afternoon we have had weddings involving two of our members: Jeremy & Marnee Rohlf and Payton & Dane Treiber.

Next Sunday we are planning for the confirmation of six Junior Confirmands. Even with guests attending worship, we will have plenty of room, so don't stay away from worship! Or, if you would rather, please attend on Saturday evening.

Please also remember our Saturday evening worship (5 p.m.) if you have other plans on Sunday. Please do not let the busy-ness of life keep you from worship! Plan ahead and keep the most important time of your week. The same is true if you will be vacationing in the coming months. Plan ahead and visit a church where you will be. You can search for churches and worship times by going to our Synod's website-lcms.org When you open the site, click in the upper right hand corner on the "Locators" tab. Then click on "Find a Church." The congregation's phone number will also be listed. I encourage you to call ahead, because sometimes the worship times have been changed from what is listed on the web site.

Our Youth and Families went to Mission Central back in January and we had a great attendance. Other members joined us for the special opportunity made possible for us by Gary Thies. As you heard in our Bd of Education and Youth Report, our Youth and Families went to pack at Mercy Meals of Siouxland in February. I joined them for both of these events, but I opted out when they went snow tubing following the Mercy Meals packing! Angela Korner was our very capable organizer and Angela helped Amanda Bruhn, and together they planned and organized a wonderful Easter Breakfast last Sunday morning.
