THE OPENING VERSES












THE PSALM Psalm 80:1-10, 14-19 (ESV)

- P: Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, You who lead Joseph like a flock.
- C: You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth.
- P: Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh, stir up Your might and come to save us!


