From Your Pastor

Matthew's account of Jesus' birth does not get as much focus as does that of Luke's. Most Sunday School Christmas programs are based on Luke's account—after all, there are more players in Luke's account, and so more parts! Matthew just gives focus to Joseph and the angel who speaks to him. I suppose we could say that Matthew gives us the adult version and the man's perspective of Jesus' birth.

Matthew tells us of Joseph—a just man, a good, righteous, honorable, faithful man. Joseph was the kind of man you would want your daughter or your sister to marry. We need more men like Joseph!

Matthew tells us of Joseph, a good man, who finds himself in a very bad situation. We know the story so well—we know how it turns out—after the angel came to tell Joseph about what was in God's plan for Mary and him. But try to image what it was like for Joseph, just for a moment—in the time during which he first found out Mary was pregnant and before the angel appeared to him in a dream to tell him what God was doing in their lives. Joseph's betrothed—and betrothal was a legally binding covenant between a man and a woman *before* they came together in marriage—Mary, was found to be pregnant and he was not the father!

Joseph was a good man, but he couldn't just look the other way. Good and honorable man that he was, neither could he subject Mary to the most humiliating consequences. "Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way" (Matthew 1:18): there was a good man with only bad options.

We understand what it means to strive to live the Christian life, only to be faced with bad options. Many of us will be together at Christmas gatherings with family members who care very little for Jesus and the things of God, even are antagonistic to all that we believe. There you are, Christian—a good man, or a good woman—and you are faced with the reality of having these conversations, which you have had before, and you know how they have gone. Still, how can you stay silent? So here are your options: are you going to make it uncomfortable for everyone again this Christmas, or will you "keep the peace," and keep your mouth shut?

Then, there is the expectation of all the gifts. You don't want to go along with the consumerism of our culture—and you are already up to your eyeballs in debt—but it's Christmas, right? Life in this world for good men and good women—and maybe, especially for good men and good women—often only offers us bad options.

Now in Joseph's case—and Mary's case—God was doing something very unique and special, so He sends His angel to tell them of His plan and their parts in it. Joseph, being a man of faith and a good man, does what he is told. He takes Mary as his wife. I imagine he was still very much afraid, but he takes Mary and he names the Boy when He is born, just as he was told.

The Boy grows into a good man—if ever there was One! This Boy, named by Joseph, His adopted father, grows to be a Man and takes upon Himself the very worst possible option there is—not out of compulsion, but out of compassion—that He might save His people from their sins, even the "good" ones, like the one writing this article and you who are reading it.

Through His Son God saves us, just as He saved Joseph, and He sends us, just as He sent Joseph, to name the One who saves us from our sins, to name the One who saves all people from all sin-for all who will receive Him in faith. So, we name Him, day in and day out, in what we think and what we say and what we do-in all life's options! We name Him everywhere we go, around our own tables, and we name Him around His own table! We name Him before a crooked and twisted generation that needs a Savior. We name Him, who puts His saving name on us, for that is our calling His people. This is our privilege and in every opportunity we have in this coming season, we will call His name: Jesus, as the angel told Joseph! You shall call His name Jesus!

From Your library . . . "Have we got a book for you!"



Facing Your Giants By Max Lucado

A non-fiction book entitled Facing Your Giants by Max Lucado is in our library and it deals with facing our giant, Goliath, in this life. He taunts us with bills we struggle to pay, people we can't please, habits we can't break, failures we can't forget, a future we can't face, etc.

This book compares us to David—you could familiarize yourself with his story and wonder what God saw in him. As the author says, David fell as often as he stood and stumbled as often as he conquered, but David gives us this reminder:

"Focus on giants—you stumble.

Focus on God—your giants tumble."

David's life story was punctuated with <u>nevertheless</u>—the runt of eight brothers, <u>nevertheless</u>, he was chosen to be King of Israel. He was nicknamed "Twiggy" by a nine foot adversary, <u>nevertheless</u>, he slew Goliath with a strip of leather and a pebble.

As king he committed adultery and murder, <u>nevertheless</u>, he was called a "man after God's own heart." As the author stated in this book, "Do you need a '<u>nevertheless</u>' to be written in your biography? You face giants, <u>nevertheless</u>, God will strengthen you.

Max Lucado is a senior minister for a church in San Antonio, Texas. He is the author of multiple best sellers, both fiction and non-fiction, and is one of America's leading inspirational authors. There are several of his books in our library for your reading pleasure.

It's true when people say your life picks up speed as you get older! I can hardly believe we'll be having the Christmas program in three weeks. I am sitting here reflecting (and praying) about what would be fun to share with you. The Scripture James 1:22 came to mind. "But be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." I have a student who seems to be a highly auditory learner. I suspect so because often children who learn this way can (and need to be) moving around while they are listening to the story. Yet when asked a question regarding the story, they are able to easily pull up the information. This happened the other day and, as always, I had to internally chuckle. It is humorous because we can think the person moving around isn't paying attention when in fact it's what they need to do to learn

It feels like there are two applicable lessons from this example. The first being, we need to check ourselves when we're thinking about passing judgment on someone's spiritual life. You may think they are the person who is far from surrendering their life to the Lord. They appear to be doing their own thing and not engaged in what we would think was important. However, they may very well be the one who is closest to tuning into the call of Holy Spirit for repentance and intimacy in their walk with the Lord. God is sovereign. He knows far better than us whose heart is ready. I pray I will set aside my fleshly/natural vision and begin to more consistently allow my heart to see life from a spiritual perspective. Second, just as this student heard and

Second, just as this student heard and applied (by recollecting and verbalizing the answer), it is important for us to apply the Word into our own lives. Of course, we need to allow Holy Spirit to bring it to life. Are we willing to do it? Can we lay down the control of how we think things should work and instead let the Word lead us? As we head into the Christmas season, I pray that we'll remember there are people hurting. Yes, even people in our own circle of relationships. Let's pray for opportunities to be doers of the Word and listen carefully as those doors open to share the incredible Truth of Christmas. God's gift of Jesus!



Main Street Wing Local LCMS pastors attend recording days about every two months to record a liturgy and sermon. These services are then edited to include regional choirs and aired on location television stations. Six unique regional services are produced and aired each week.

- * The mission of Main Street Living is to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ using television and other media.
- * Main Street is NOT intended to be a replacement for inperson worship, but is here to provide liturgical services to those who are unable to attend a local service.
- * The main source of support comes from viewers and their families in the form of mail-in donations, online donations and memorials which are tax-deductible.
- * MSL is a designated 501(c)(3) corporation in the state of South Dakota. It is governed by a board of directors and facilitated by an Executive Director. Additionally, each market has its own leadership and production teams who recruit, schedule and record pastors and choirs-as well as process local donations.
- * Choirs are comprised of members from surrounding LCMS congregations. Choir recording sessions meet at area churches and record around a dozen hymns to be edited into future services.
- * The program is broadcast each Sunday at 10 am on KCAU-Sioux City or at 10:30 am on WOWT-Omaha.
- * MSL can be viewed anytime at MainStreetLiving.com or their Facebook page.





Shashemene Prison Visitation

Rev. Mengistu and a group of 11 youths from his congregation visited the Shashemene Prison, bringing gifts for the inmates.
