10th Sunday after Pentecost (John 6:1-15): Your gifts to the church can be multiplied in service to the Lord. Often this takes the form of "matching funds." You are a Christian today perhaps because a former in 1654 offered some potatoes in the Lord's service. What your gift may accomplish is in the hands of the Lord. The boy on the hill offered a box lunch. Look what happened when our Lord put it to work!
