THE INVOCATION, CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P: In the name of the Father and of the

 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- C: But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

(Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.)

- P: Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.
- C: Most merciful God, I a poor, miserable sinner, plead guilty before You of all my sins. I have lived as if You did not matter and as if I mattered most of all. Your name, O Lord, I have not honored as I ought; my worship and prayers have faltered. I have not let Your love persuade me and so my love for others has failed. There are those whom I have hurt and those whom I have failed to help. My thoughts and desires are soiled with sin. I am sorry for all of this and I beg You for Your grace to forgive me all my sins and grant me Your Spirit to amend my sinful life.

(The candle on the Lenten Cross is extinguished.)

P: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE PSALM OF THE DAY Psalm 91—selected verses (TLT)

- P: Let him who lives in the shelter of the Most High, and stays in the shadow of the Almighty,
- C: say to the Lord, "My Refuge and my Fortress, my God Whom I trust!"
- P: He is the One Who will rescue you from the snare and from the deadly plague.
- C: He will cover you with His feathers, and under His wings you will find refuge.
- P: His truth is a shield and an armor. You need not be afraid of anything dreadful at night,
- C: an arrow flying during the day, the pestilence moving in the dark, or the plague ravaging at noon.
- P: A thousand may fall at your side and ten thousand at your right,
- C: but it will not come near you.
- P: If you have made the Lord, who is my Refuge, the Most High, your Home,
- C: He will not let any harm come to you or disaster come near your shelter,
- P: because He orders His angels to be with you and protect you everywhere you go.
- C: They will carry you in their hands and not let you stub your foot against a stone.
- P: You will step on a lion or a cobra and trample on a young lion or a serpent.
- C: Because he clings to Me in love, I will rescue him and put him in a safe high place, because he knows My name.
- P: When he calls Me, I will answer him,
- C: I will be with him in trouble, rescue him, and honor him. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

P: Let us pray. O almighty and eternal God, we implore You to direct, sanctify, and govern our hearts and bodies in the ways of Your laws and the works of Your commandments that through Your mighty protection, both now and ever, we may be preserved in body and in soul; through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING Deuteronomy 26:1-11 (ESV)

When you come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you for an inheritance and have taken possession of it and live in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from your land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket, and you shall go to the place that the Lord your God will choose, to make His name to dwell there. And you shall go to the priest who is in office at that time and say to him, "I declare today to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our fathers to give us." Then the priest shall take the basket from your hand and set it down before the altar of the Lord your God. And you shall make response before the Lord your God, "A wandering Aramean was my father. And he went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number, and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly and humiliated us and laid on us hard labor. Then we cried to the Lord, the God of our fathers, and the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. And the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great deeds of terror, with signs and wonders. And He brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which You, O Lord, have given me." And you shall set it down before the Lord your God and worship before the Lord your God. And you shall rejoice in all the good that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house, you, and the Levite, and the sojourner who is among you.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

THE EPISTLE Romans 10:8b-13 (ESV)

"The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" [Deuteronomy 30:14] (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in Him will not be put to shame" [Isaiah 28:16]. For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing His riches on all who call on Him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" [Joel 2:32].

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

THE VERSE (sung) (page 157 in front of the hymnal) (Joel 2:13)
Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and abounding in steadfast love.

THE HOLY GOSPEL Luke 4:1-13 (ESV)

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourth chapter.

C: (sung) Glory to You, O Lord.

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And He ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, He was hungry. The devil said to Him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." And Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone'" [Deuteronomy 8:3]. And the devil took Him up and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to Him, "To You I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If You, then, will worship me, it will all be Yours." And Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only shall you serve'" [Deuteronomy 6:13]. And he took Him to Jerusalem and set Him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down from here, for it is written, 'He will command His angels concerning You, to guard You,' and 'On their hands they will bear You up, lest you strike Your foot against a stone'" [Psalm 91:11-12]. And Jesus answered him, "It is said, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test'" [Deuteronomy 6:16]. And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from Him until an opportune time.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: (sung) Praise to You, O Christ.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. 
