REFORMATION SUNDAY October 27, 2024 "Saving Sight for the Blind"

AS WE GATHER

Today we remember the Reformation which God graciously brought to His church through the work of Martin Luther and his co-workers. After struggling for years trying to earn God's love and forgiveness, Luther realized that there was nothing he could do to earn them and he didn't have to, because God had given them for free. Luther's three main themes were:

We are saved by God's **Grace Alone**, through **Faith** in Jesus Christ **Alone**.

<u>Scripture Alone (God's Word)</u> is the ultimate authority on God and our life with Him. Luther's attempts to reform the Roman Catholic church from within failed, but through Luther God restored the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ as the focus of Christian faith and life.

IN LUTHER'S UPBRINGING, God's "righteousness" was understood as the truth by which God condemns those who have sinned. In his study of the Bible, however, the Holy Spirit led him to see that Christ's righteousness is something we are freely given by God's grace through faith! (Romans 3:22). That wondrous truth was the basis for the **REFORMATION!** That wondrous truth was the basis for the **Lord's Supper,** for herein Christ is present with His body and blood to give us His forgiveness. In joyful obedience to the teaching of Scripture, we practice close communion and ask <u>guests</u> desiring to commune to speak with the pastor before the service.

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Enable us by Your Holy Spirit to live under You in Your kingdom and to serve You in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness. Amen.

P: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE INTROIT Psalm 34:1-2, 11, 22; antiphon: Psalm 119:46

Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people. And he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give Him glory, because the hour of His judgment has come, and worship Him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

THE EPISTLE Romans 3:19-28 (ESV)

Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of

sin. But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood [the sacrifice to pay for sin] to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.





And Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he recovered his sight and followed Him on the way.




